



## CURBSIDE VOTING

Any voter who cannot reach the voting area at the polling site because of architectural barriers or physical limitations may request to vote “curbside” (outside of the polling site). This is an uncommon situation, but it is important to be aware of this service. Most likely the voter will send their companion inside to let the poll worker know a voter needs assistance.

If a voter requests curbside voting, assist them by doing the following:

- Two poll workers take the roster, ballot (if it is a Presidential Primary Election, check for party preference), pen, secrecy sleeve, an “I Voted” sticker, and any other necessary election material to the voter.
- The voter signs the roster, one poll worker will immediately return it to the clerks table inside the polling site.
- The second poll worker should ask the voter to review their ballot before placing it in the secrecy sleeve.
- The voter will vote their ballot and place it in the secrecy sleeve.
- The second poll worker will take the voted ballot into the polling site and insert the ballot into the Ballot Box.

### Is a family member on the ballot?

Poll workers are not permitted to work in district where a family member is on the ballot. Please notify the election’s office as soon as possible if someone in your family is a candidate on the ballot in the upcoming election and we will work to change your assignment.

## Voter Challenged (California Elections Code § 14240)

A voter may be orally challenged within the polling site **only** by a member of the precinct board for any of the following reasons:

- The voter is not the person whose name appears on the roster.
- The voter is not a resident of the precinct.
- The voter is not a citizen of the United States.
- The voter has voted that day.
- The voter is presently on parole for the conviction of a felony.

Challenges may be made only upon sufficient probable cause based on personal factual knowledge.

If you have personal knowledge that questions a persons right to vote, gently ask the voter to clarify their information. If they fall into one of the reasons listed above and insist on voting, let them vote provisionally. Be sure to fill out an incident report.
