TO ADDRESS THE SHASTA COUNTY REDISTRICTING ADVISORY COMMISSION (CRAC): The CRAC provides the members of the public with a Public Comment-Open Time period, where the public may directly address the CRAC on any agenda item on the regular calendar and on the consent calendar and may also address the CRAC on any matter not listed on the agenda that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the CRAC. In addition, members of the public may also comment on any item on the agenda before the CRAC's consideration of the agenda and may also comment on any item on the agenda before or during the CRAC's consideration of the item. Members of the public may also address matters scheduled for public hearings at the time such public hearings are opened for comment. Pursuant to the Brown Act (Govt. Code Section 54950, et seq.), CRAC action or discussion cannot be taken on non-agenda matters, but the CRAC may briefly respond to statements or questions and, if deemed necessary, refer the subject matter to the appropriate department for follow-up and/or to schedule the matter on a subsequent CRAC Agenda. Persons wishing to address the CRAC in the meeting are requested to fill out a Speaker Request Form and provide it to the Clerk before the meeting begins. If you have documents to present for the members of the CRAC to review, please provide a minimum of ten copies. When addressing the CRAC in the meeting, please approach the rostrum, and after receiving recognition from the Chair, give your comments.

Comments should be limited to matters within the subject matter jurisdiction of the CRAC.

The CRAC wishes to ensure that business is conducted in an orderly fashion and that all have an equal opportunity to observe and participate in the proceedings. Each person who addresses the CRAC shall not use loud, threatening, profane, or abusive language which disrupts, disturbs, or otherwise impedes the orderly conduct of the meeting. Any such language or any other disorderly conduct which disrupts, disturbs, or otherwise impedes the orderly conduct of the CRAC meeting is prohibited.

REDISTRICTING

Every 10 years, following the release of census data, supervisorial districts must be redrawn so that each district is relatively equal in population.



Shasta County

WHY REDISTRICTING IS IMPORTANT:

- Allows districts to be rebalanced, ensuring the greatest extent possible that all districts are both equally populated and represented.
- Determines which neighborhoods and communities are grouped together into a supervisorial district for purposes of electing a Board of Supervisors member.
- Determines who and what appears on your ballot.
- Determines where you can vote and who represents you.

COMMUNITY OF INTEREST:

Defined in California law as, *“A population that shares common social or economic interests that should be included within a single district for purposes of its effective and fair representation”*.

- Lifestyle: recreation, shared social gatherings, community character.
- Economy: major employer/industry, commercial areas.
- Demography: income, education, language, immigration status, housing, etc.
- Geography: urban/suburban/rural, mountains, coastal.
- Political subdivisions: school districts, planning areas, etc.
- Placed-based issues/needs: public safety (wildfire concerns), environmental (air pollution).

NOT a Community of Interest: *“Communities of interest do not include relationships with political parties, incumbents or political candidates”*.

GEOGRAPHIC INTEGRITY

Respect to the geographic integrity of any city, county, city and county, local neighborhood or local community of interest.
